Playground Update

A number of contractors have been out and inspected the playground and we have been advised that we should be able to repair what is there (rather than having to replace all the equipment, as had been previously feared).

To this end we are getting quotes from 3 different providers with a view to going ahead with work shortly. Depending on cost, this may have to be done in stages.

Rebuilding the public jetty by the river

Myself and Hilary Shaw met with the owners of Beetle and Wedge House in April. We agreed to collaborate on repairs, since the current public landing stage is joined to their private section.

We will be arranging an initial quote for a like for like replacement, as the current structure is uneven and quietly rotting away! However, we are also considering how we might enhance this area, depending on costs and funds available. Possible changes include:

- Clearer signage in the surrounding area to indicate where the public access is.
- Potentially adding a ladder down to the water. This would provide easier access for wild swimmers and other river users.

In order to make these changes it is likely that we will need to raise donations from the village. We will also approach Oxford County Council and other sources of funding to see whether there are any grants that we can access.

As mentioned before, if you would like to be involved in helping with this project, please contact Sue Powell or Hilary Shaw – we would welcome your ideas and energy!

Working Highways Group

As previously mentioned, the views in the village and on the council are split regarding whether we should move to 20mph through the village and, indeed, how effective such a change would be in bringing the speed of traffic down.

Given the complexity and cost of potential Highway changes, we are therefore still looking for volunteers from the village to participate in a working Highways group and help us determine the next steps forward. Involvement would probably be on an intermittent basis for around 6 -8 months max.

Interestingly, I was shown a document recently, written by a Moulsford Parish councillor about 10 years ago and which accurately reflects where we are today! I suspect that to move things forwards and get what we feel best meets our needs, again some investment will be required – both from Oxfordshire County Council and from the village itself.

Parish Audit

As anyone who has ever served on the Parish Council knows, we are currently in audit season. This represents a significant amount of work; as a public body, we need to prepare annual financial accounts, plus update risk assessments and review working procedures.

Plus standards seem to get more rigorous every year, with an increased focus on efficiency and robustness.

My thanks go to our clerk, Andrew Harris, for gathering much of the information needed for the audit, plus to Councillor Ben Partridge, for preparing the financial accounts. We hope to approve all materials by end of June and will post all relevant documents on both the website and village noticeboard, as in previous years.

From the Vicar Rebecca Peters

Dear Friends.

Do you ever struggle with Doubts? Do you ever look at other Christians and wonder: "Do they REALLY believe this Christian stuff? That Jesus really was the Son of God who rose again, and is alive today?"

Doubt is an honest place to be, and it is not the opposite of Christian faith. To believe is to be in one mind. To disbelieve is to be in one mind also. To doubt is to waver between the two minds, to be in a state of 'double-ness', or 'two-ness'. To doubt something is to be willing to believe it – IF you can find evidence to back up the story.

If you are in this state of 'double-ness' just now, you may find the story of the disciple Thomas (John 20:24-29) to be helpful. Unlike the other disciples, he was not present on that first Easter night when Jesus appeared to the other disciples. Instead, Thomas was told that someone whom he'd seen crucified and dead was alive again three days later, and in perfect health.

Thomas had been devoted to Jesus, but the fact that dead people don't rise again was just too much for him. So, despite the joy of the other disciples, he could get only as far as: "unless I see the nail marks... I will not believe it."

It was a week later that Jesus appeared again to His disciples and confronted Thomas. He said simply: "Put your finger here; see my hands... Stop doubting and believe."

Jesus then looked forward to all the millions of people in the future who would never meet Him in person, and so would have understandable grounds to doubt. "Because you have seen Me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."

Thomas needed physical recognition before he could say "My Lord and My God." Today, if you want to believe, but honestly struggle with doubt, consider using this simple prayer:

"Lord Jesus, I have never seen You in person. So, I sometimes doubt that you exist. The Bible tells us that it is only the Holy Spirit who can open our 'spiritual eyes', and so I ask You to do that for me. Please give me not physical recognition, but faith recognition. I will do my bit, and will read about you each day in the Bible. Through Your Word, please open my spiritual eyes so that I can see You clearly as Jesus, the risen Son of God. Amen."





Markets are held in St Mary's Church in the centre of Wallingford. Usually, our food stalls can be found outside with our craft stalls inside.



Wallingford Accessible Boat Club celebrates London Marathon runner Abi Turner on her amazing success!

Abi, a member of Benson Striders Running Club, raises over £2500 for support of the WABC wheelyboat charity

Wallingford Accessible Boat Club (WABC), the local charity which enables disabled and less mobile people to get out and about on the River Thames, is today celebrating local resident Abi Turner's amazing feat of completing the London Marathon and raising the huge sum of £2500 for the club.

Recently heralded as the first WABC Community Champion, Abi achieved a very respectable time of just over 5 hours to complete the Marathon course, despite some painful cramping of her feet. But the support of so many of Abi's friends and WABC members helped to keep her going.

Abi said: "It was hard work from the 18-mile mark but I knew I had to keep going and just get on with it! I feel so pleased with myself and so very happy that I have managed to raise so much money for such a deserving cause. WABC do an amazing service for the local community and I am proud to be one of their Community Champions."

WABC Chairman, John Jenkins MBE, was thrilled by Abi's huge effort: "We are so excited for Abi and so very grateful to her for what was a marvellous effort – to achieve her lifelong ambition is very special for her. And her enthusiasm to support WABC is very contagious – it has rubbed off on a friend, Becky Shaw, who runs a Chi-Chi dance school in Cholsey and Benson, who has decided to raise money for WABC too. Wallingford Accessible Boat Club - Bookings to commence on 20th May!

The wonders of the River Thames await disabled and elderly people in Oxfordshire!

Wallingford Accessible Boat Club (WABC), the local charity which enables disabled and less mobile people to get out and about on the River Thames, today announced that bookings are now available for river voyages as from 20th May. All disabled and less mobile people, wheelchair users and ambulant, from in and around South Oxfordshire are encouraged to take advantage of free of charge trips in the Club's Wheelyboat, WOW-one.

WABC Chairman John Jenkins MBE, commented: "At last the condition of the river has improved, as has the weather, and we can get on with our river trips. We are all excited by the prospect of a wonderful summer of boating ahead and are geared up for what we expect to be a very busy season. Last year we took out 252 passengers over 65 trips and we fully expect to do even better this year - that's more disabled and elderly, with their friends and families, out on the river for a free of charge trip. Our wheelyboat, WOW-one is in gleaming condition, complete with a few additional accessories to aid our passengers and crew members alike."

Jenkins continued: "Our new booking system, introduced last year, proved itself making it very easy for clients to book a voyage and for our crew members to review their duty schedules. All our clients have to do is go to www.wabc.org.uk/book and enter the required details of their friends and family members who will be accompanying them. It couldn't be easier. And a glorious trip on our lovely river awaits, totally free of charge!!"


