Coffee Shop

Our thanks go to Gail Slinger, who after 15 years has decided to step down from the Chair of the Wed Coffee Shop.

During Gail's time and supported by many villagers, the Coffee Shop has grown from strength to strength and the delicious cakes and great company are appreciated by many.

Linda Dixon and Alison Fagg have kindly agreed to take over from Gail and I am sure they will appreciate your ongoing support to help run the Coffee Shop going forward.

Village Allotments

As you may be aware, Moulsford has 8 allotments available for use by villagers; these are accessed directly off Underhill and are behind the sewage treatment works.

The allotments are of varying size. Some of these are already in use but there are several available for rental from Moulsford Parish Council. Note that should these additional allotments not be taken up by villagers, we may offer them on to people in the area; it is in everyone's interest that all plots are regularly maintained.

The land for the allotments is not owned by Moulsford Parish Council but instead is leased directly from SODC. Moulsford Parish Council incurs a charge for this which we pass on with a small uplift to cover water etc.; we can advise new charges shortly.

All allotment holders are asked to sign an agreement regarding the usage and upkeep of the plot they rent. Please contact Sue Powell (<u>spowell@moulsford-pc.org.uk</u>) or Melanie Mousley Jones (<u>mmousleyjones@moulsford-pc.org.uk</u>) if you are interested in finding out more.

Broadband at the Pavilion

The eagle eyed amongst you might have spotted we now have broadband available in the Pavilion. We are working with the Pavilion Management Committee to test our security procedures, then intend to make it available to all hirers.

At present we do not have plans to open it to all villagers since this might result in a capacity issue.

Cranford School

The council have had a couple of meetings with Cranford School, including discussing traffic congestion and future development plans. The meetings have been both informative and productive.

We are encouraging representatives from the school to attend a future Parish Council meeting, with the hope that you can come along and ask any questions of them that you may have. More information to follow.

Highway Speed Monitoring

As was featured in last month's Moulsford News, Oxford County Council Highways undertook a 7 Day Speed Data survey for the period 8/9/23 to 20/9/23.

The Parish Council has been advised by OCC as follows:

"For a compliant 30mph we are looking for a mean speed of 30mph or less and an 85th percentile speed of 35mph or less. As I hope you can see, all locations are generally around this threshold with only site 3 Northbound being a marginal 0.15mph above this. So in summary, you've currently a 30mph speed limit that is generally compliant."

20 mph speed limit on A329 through Moulsford

The majority of towns and villages in Oxfordshire are considering whether to move to a 20mph speed limit, or have already done so.

As advised in last month's Moulsford News, the Parish Council have expressed interest to Oxfordshire County Council to reduce the 30mph speed limit on the A329 through Moulsford to 20mph.

However, we recognise that there are differences of opinion within the village on this subject so to gauge the level of support for a 20mph limit, we will be conducting an informal survey. This will shortly be available online via the Village website, with a hard copy version in next month's MN; we would encourage as many of you as possible to complete this.

It is important to emphasise that this will not be the only consultation that takes place. Once an actual scheme has been proposed, OCC will itself conduct a further, more formal survey.

Hence if a 20mph for Moulsford is approved, it will be some months before it is introduced.

Recreation Ground

We're looking for more volunteers (thank you to those of you who have already come forward) to help with the initial clear up being planned for the recreation ground.

The date will be tied it in with some tree work if possible, so we're yet to confirm exactly when it will be scheduled. However, if you're interested in getting involved, please contact Melanie Mousley Jones <u>mmousleyjones@moulsford-pc.org.uk</u>.

Meanwhile, there's some scaffolding - at least 10 scaffolding poles + 3 connector joints - in the wooded area at the west end of the recreation ground (where the umpire/cricket shed used to be) that need to be cleared away:

3 x poles @ c. 6230mm (21')

7 x poles @ c. 3200mm (10'7")

3 x 3 way through 90 degree corner joints

From the Vicar

Dear Friends,

Since starting as vicar I've become more aware of how important it is to be present as part of the community, in order to enable a community to grow and flourish. As Christians we are called to walk the journey of faith together, to go deeper in our faith, to find encouragement, support - prayerful and practical, joyful companionship and community. There are a number of different communities across the Benefice (Cholsey and Moulsford), those attending different services, Home groups, Forest church community, the Old Vicarage Moulsford, youth group to name just a few!

Being able to be present is important, so in order to enable myself to be present more regularly (more than once a month) at St John the Baptist Moulsford services and to be present at St Mary's Cholsey services, I would like to change the service times across the Benefice.

This would mean that St John the Baptist Moulsford would change service start times from 9:30am to 9am and St Mary's Cholsey service start times from 9:45am to 10:30am (see table below). As a United Benefice we would therefore also have the opportunity to attend each other's churches more regularly.

St John the Baptist PCC have discussed this proposal and have agreed to change the service times, please see table below. We hope to implement these changes at the beginning of January 2024, with a review after 6 months. These proposed changes are to enable the growth and flourishing of the church across the Benefice. If you have any feedback or comments or questions, please do talk to myself, the Churchwarden or PCC members.

As you may know Breyan and Janet Knowles are hoping to retire and are stepping down from some of their roles, treasurer and churchwarden (Easter/next APCM), which will mean that we need new people to step into leadership roles and to explore different ways of working as a church.

If anyone is able to play the piano or organ or Keyboard, or any instrument, for church services, once a month, please do get in touch with myself.

We are hugely grateful to Janet and Breyan and are glad that they will continue to support the church, and also the way they are facilitating the transition of responsibilities to different people.

Wallingford Accessible Boat Club announces amazing performance results for 2023 season

Over 250 disabled people, their family and friends, enjoy the delights of the river!

Wallingford Accessible Boat Club (WABC), the local charity which enables disabled and generally immobile people to get out and about on the River Thames completely free of charge, today released positively astounding performance figures for the April-September season.

Over 250 disabled people with a wide range of disabilities, together with their friends and families, took advantage of the Club's wheelyboat service to enable them to enjoy the delights of boating on the river - to enjoy an experience that they thought was totally out of reach for them.

The extent of the statistics over the 6 months achieved by the Club's all-volunteer Team is staggering:

- ** 65 Voyages in the Club's specially-adapted wheelyboat, WOW-one;
- ** 252 Passengers carried, including 41 Wheelchair Users and 12 Powerchair Users;

** Passengers with one of 22 different disabilities, including Cancer, Stroke, Dementia, MS, ADHD, Spinal Conditions, Polio, Blindness, Deafness, Cerebral Palsy, Autism, and Learning Disabilities.

John Jenkins MBE, Chair of WABC, was very upbeat about the figures: "We are all so delighted by the Team's great performance this past season. What a tremendous effort and shows just what can be achieved by a committed, like-minded team of river-loving volunteers who are dedicated to enabling others, not so fortunate as themselves, to enjoy what they all enjoy – getting out on the river."

Jenkins continued: "I believe 2023 is the year we have come of age – now delivering what we set out to deliver in 2016 when we had the vision to enable an often-neglected segment of our community – disabled and generally immobile people - to enjoy the same pleasures as the able-bodied. And all achieved by volunteers. We have every right to feel very proud of ourselves!"

Wallingford Accessible Boat Club is recruiting

Additional wheelyboat crews & fundraiser needed for 2024 season

Wallingford Accessible Boat Club (WABC), the local charity which enables disabled and less mobile people to get out and about on the River Thames completely free of charge, announced today it is seeking to recruit additional crew members and a Fundraising Officer in readiness for next season to enable the Club to offer more river trips to more passengers.

This announcement follows the extraordinary success announced by this local charity earlier this month that they delivered river trips to over 250 disabled and less mobile people together with their friends and families from all over South Oxfordshire and beyond during the past season (completed end September) bringing a huge amount of pleasure to all.

WABC Chairman John Jenkins MBE explained: "We had a wonderful boating season this year and our volunteer crews were just great managing all the passenger requests we had for river trips. Typically each week we offered trips Tuesday to Friday and, later in the season, to Saturday but at times, particularly in the holiday season, we were really stretched. We want to get to a position where we can operate trips every day of the week apart maybe from Sunday – the demand is there and we are determined to fulfil it. More trips means of course more cost so we need some focused resource to help cover the costs, hence our requirement to recruit a Fundraising Officer for a few hours each month."

Jenkins continued: "To meet this objective we need more wheelyboat crews which is why we are making this appeal now so that we can get all the necessary training completed before March time next year when we hope we will be able to get our wheelyboat WOW-one back on the water for familiarisation training. We are seeking river-loving people ideally with experience of river craft management who ideally live relatively local to the Wallingford area. We will provide all necessary training at the Club's cost. Additionally, we are seeking a Fundraising Officer to help us raise the necessary funds to operate existing and additional trips."

"WABC is a fun organisation and we already have a wonderful volunteer team of river lovers who simply want to pass on the enjoyment they have to others not so fortunate as themselves – we simply need more of them."

Gardening diary



This month I have worked on some more stuff in my plant bed.

I harvested my pumpkins, which were unfortunately not the biggest ones, then I weeded out the entire bed after Emily helped me take down the runner beans.

I filled three tubs full of the mulch that we prepared last year and spread it all over the bed. I left the nasturtium though, as slugs and snails eat that instead of the veggies that we want to eat. It is a sacrificial plant because it draws pests away from the plant you want to keep alive. Their flowers are also great for pollinators. Lastly I planted some garlic at the bottom of my bed.

You can use broken plant pots to make plant markers. You can paint or draw on these with metallic pens. This can be a fun project for kids but you have to be careful since the edges can sometimes be sharp.




