Floristic Margin – Wild Flowers

- Wildlife
 - Bees
 - Insects
 - Birds



During Lockdown, there was a healthy increase in ramblers/Dog Walkers on the farm however, a significant number of these took to Floristic Margins leading to a reduction of around 50% of the normal wild birds we would see, in these

areas

Grass Margin - Headlands

- Popular for Ground nesting Birds
 - 4 Coveys of English Partridge spotted last year 1st time in 20-25 years that this quantity has been seen after strong encouragement during this time
 - Variety of other birds seen including: Skylarks, Gold Finch, Blue Tits and Barn Owls, in the Autumn
 - Hedge nesting birds also in good numbers plenty of hedgerows on the farm, of which 70-80% have been planted by john, with very little outside funding
- Try to keep on top of certain wild plants/trees as they can become invasive
 - Ragwoort
 - Ivy
 - Elder
 - Thistles



Wild Bird Feed

- Seeds planted
 - Millet
 - Mustard
 - Sorghum





Base seeds for stewardship, though these also include the 'Wild Bird Mix' of wild flowers – that can be seen on the headlands/roadsides

- Wild Birds
 - Kites –First seen at Greenland Farm in ~2000. Numbers have significantly increased since then. 'Bully' of Greenlands sky. Will have prey off Buzzards, etc.
 - Pheasants
 - White Throat
 - ► Hawfinch seen this year for the 1st time in ~10 years

Other Wildlife

- Deer Roe/Muntjack
- Hares
- Badgers





Changing Times

- Greenlands used to be a Pig Farm and there have been noticeable changes since those days
- House Martin Numbers are down
 - Pig muck no longer available for them to use in building their nests
 - Climate change also having an impact
- Swallows returned this year after having none in 2021
