Throughout the summer, we've had a wonderful selection of Friday night dining, so a massive thank you to all our contributors and also to Jo Haywood who co-ordinated the food rota. The Events team put in the work to keep the beer and wine flowing, and with valuable help of volunteers to get the bar sorted out for both opening and closing times. Cheers to all of you whose many hands go such a long way to making it light work for everyone, along the way helping to make Moulsford the special place it is on a summer Friday evening. We've also made a great start on reducing our plastic waste with many folks remembering to bring along their own glasses every night; thank you for helping with this too!

One question that has been asked - and an excellent question it is - is where does the money go from all those pints and carefully measured wines, after we've covered the hire of the Pavilion and other outlays like cleaning and buying the drinks in the first place. The Moulsford Events Committee is still a sub-committee of the Moulsford Parish Council, so basically Events money is Parish Council money and our profits go to MPC to spend where needed to maintain and enhance the village. This can include paying to mow the Rec, emptying dog poo bins, and adding to the funds kept to maintain our Pavilion. But, it will also be helping fund the new football goal posts about to go in, that I know will be a big hit with our village kids. All for a pint of fresh local real ale at £4...

The MEC's other principle remit (and some might say the most important) is putting on social events welcoming everyone in Moulsford with an aim of bringing the community together. The Friday socials are one part; now we can look forwards to the Comedy Night, then the Christmas Gala, and then... Next year is being planned; we might see the return of the Boat trip and do our best to make it affordable, especially for our popular family voyage.

But for now I look forwards to seeing many of you at the Comedy Night, which has been fantastically well supported and is sold out, thank you! Please don't forget to bring your reusable glasses... Then I'll be looking ahead to the Christmas Gala Night Friday, 13th December at the Beetle and Wedge (tickets still available; we'll have them at the Comedy Night, watch out for them on Facebook or contact Stephanie on 07763727860) and then finally, it'll our Christmas social on Friday, 20th December. Santa will be coming...



This month's entry is very detailed and essentially a request for more villagers to get involved in helping maintain the village and support the parish council. This cannot be done by the parish council alone, without significantly increasing the precept in order to allow us to use third party companies to help us. We are also finding that as resources get constrained at district and county level, more is falling on us at the parish level. Finally, there is a significant amount of legislation which we now have to follow in order to ensure transparency and accountability; unfortunately this has a tendency to slow everything down! Please don't switch off at the length of this article but instead read on to find out how you can help us. All ideas welcome.

Village Maintenance - Volunteers Required

Around the village there are various items that require regular maintenance, some of which has been done quietly and with little recognition for some years, such as:

- Bus shelters the one near The Clock House has been painted regularly by Deb Mansford (I believed she may
 have roped one of her sons in too!) and the one near Ferry Lane by another villager. However, both are now
 in need of repainting, having not been done for some years.
- <u>Playground equipment</u> the council have made all necessary repairs to the playground this summer but new
 regulations mean that it really should be checked on a weekly basis in summer and a monthly basis in winter.
 The parish council are preparing a checklist to help villagers participate in this.
- Village bench by river paint is flaking off and again in need of sanding and repainting.
- <u>Verges</u> the parish council have found a map of areas that OCC used to cut. However over the years the
 areas actually cut appear to be less than this. As OCC only pay for one cut a year, the village is therefore
 looking a bit wild and woolly!

As discussed with several villagers at our last council meeting, we would like to recruit a group of volunteers to join in a working party and carry out some of this work on a regular basis (e.g. 2 – 3 times a year), as well as weed spraying, general gardening, cutting grass or vegetation, and removing weeds and moss on roads.

Meanwhile I will check on getting yellow jackets and kit, a bit like we did for the litter picking day earlier in the year.

BIFFA Visit – Village Declean

On 5th November, maintenance staff from BIFFA (on behalf of SODC) are coming out to do a "deep cleanse" operation in Moulsford. This includes litter picking, sweeping, and removing weeds or moss on pavements. However it does not include the gardening tasks outlined in the section above (e.g. weeding weeds on the road)

Please note, BIFFA only clear land to which the public is permitted access and that is under the direct control of the district council.

The parish council would like to hear from you, as a Moulsford villager, as to whether within these restrictions, if there is anywhere in particular that you would like to be cleaned. We will then collate these requests and pass back to BIFFA/SODC. Please send your input to spowell@moulsford-pc.org.uk no later than 18th October, 2024.

Update on Other Items

Bench for Badgers Bank

As I mentioned in the Sept edition, the parish council ordered a bench for Badgers Bank and had been told it should be with us by early Sept. However, the delivery date was delayed multiple times and it was finally delivered and installed about a week ago, only to realise that they had delivered the wrong item. We are working to resolve this; apologies for the delay.

SODC Councillor Grant

It turned out that the SODC Councillor grant timetable did not tie in with when we wanted to install new goal posts, so we have gone ahead with this project separately and expect the goal posts to be arriving shortly. However, we would be interested in your ideas for what might benefit the village, should we apply for the Councillors Grant for a different project. The front runner right now is a wheel chair ramp and limited tarmac application immediately around the pavilion front door.

Other sources of grants

As well as the SODC Councillors Grant there are other sources of funding available from various public bodies and charities, all with their own terms, conditions, and timelines.

Preston Bemis has kindly agreed to work with the parish council to identify these. As a first step we would like to know from you what you would like to see any grant we secured used for in order to improve the village. Bear in mind many grants are for capital projects – that is for purchase of new goods/services, rather than maintenance. Having this input from you would allow us to prioritise the grants that we can get most benefit from.

Traffic Management Group

This will be starting soon. However, ideally we would still like to recruit one or two more people to get a variety of input. Please contact spowell@moulsford-pc.org.uk if you can help – we would really appreciate it.

Speed Watch

We've had several volunteers for this and I will be contacting the police shortly to get more details of how the scheme would work and what time commitment is required. Afraid with everything else going on, have not had chance to deal with this.

Changes in Personnel @ the Parish Council

Resignation of Ben Partridge, CFO Moulsford Parish Council

It is with regret that we have to inform you that Ben Partridge has stepped down from the council, owing to family and work commitments.

We would like to thank Ben for the significant contribution he has made over his time on the last two councils and in particular, for stepping in and helping us handle the financial side of parish council audits for the last two years. Enjoy your hockey coaching, Ben! We really appreciate your support and wish you all the best.

Co-opting a New Councillor

With the resignation of Ben Partridge, there is now a vacancy on the parish council. For those of you not familiar with what Parish Councillors do, it's a volunteer role. Things we are involved with include:

- We represent the views and concerns of the residents of the parish to the parish council itself and through it to the district and/or county authority. For example, we work with SODC on planning applications and Oxfordshire Country Council on highways.
- We report back to residents on issues affecting the parish (such as the recent proposal to move to 30mph).
- We make decisions on issues that affect the local community such as planning and managing open spaces.
- We negotiate with and actively influence those other organisations who do make final decisions (e.g. related to schooling, health services, public transport, and policing).

No prior experience is needed and it's a great way to meet new people in the village, develop new skills and make a difference in the community.

New councillors joining are encouraged to undergo basic training, for which the council will cover the cost (for example, introduction to the role of a councillor, planning workshops etc). Note that anyone in employment is entitled to take leave off to attend such training during the day, many courses are also offered in the evenings. In terms of the time commitment involved in being a councillor, it's about 7-10 hours per month, depending on what responsibilities you take on. Ideally a council should include a mix of residents – different ages and skill sets – to get the widest possible range of views in discussions.


Resignation of Parish Clerk

NOTE: It's always a balance when recruiting a parish clerk as to whether to recruit someone with sound knowledge of government regulations as they pertain to parish councils, or someone with little knowledge of this but a good understanding of our local situation. We are therefore open to people who are either-qualified as a clerk, organised, a good communicator, and computer literate. A computer will be provided for use on council work.

Part time: 9 hrs/week Location: home-based

Salary: c. £15.95 - £16.21hr (depending on experience)

Moulsford Parish Council is looking for a new parish clerk, who can spare around 9 hours per week to keep our parish council running smoothly. The Clerk provides administrative and clerical support to the Council, as well as managing the Council's finances.

You'll have experience in administration or clerical work and be able to maintain accurate financial records, demonstrate a calm, organised approach to work, show attention to detail, and possess good communication and customer service skills. You should also be accustomed to using a computer, including Word processing and Excel spreadsheets.

Responsibilities include:

- Helping set up parish council meetings, then subsequently attending and taking minutes.
- Managing administration related to the parish council, including record keeping, managing the review of planning applications, and handling queries from outside organisations.
- Managing the day-to-day accounts for the parish council, as well as assisting with the smooth running
 of the annual external audit.
- Updating the village website, Facebook page, etc (e.g. notice of council meetings).
- Managing relationships with external contractors, e.g. grass cutting, general maintenance

You will be working largely independently and should be comfortable using your initiative to deal with a wide range of issues. The majority of work can be done from home, at hours to suit you, though you will need to attend the monthly parish council meetings in person.

No prior experience of working for parish councils is necessary. However, should you be successful in securing the role we would encourage you to attend suitable training, for which we would cover the cost. A laptop will also be supplied for your use.

You need to be willing to give up some of your time. How much depends on you and your commitment to work for your community without being paid.

Parish Council meets once a month (except August and January), usually on the second Thursday. Meetings normally last around 2 hours.

No prior experience needed; enthusiasm and commitment are more important. You simply need to be 18 or over, an elector and have been a resident or worked within 3 miles of the Parish for the last year.

Goal Posts

It was agreed some while ago that the goal posts need replacing, as the existing ones are badly rusted and held together with paint. Taking into account the varying and differing needs expressed by villagers, we have done a review of options and believe moveable goal posts best meet our requirements. This is for the following reasons:

- They will be positioned in the same place as the existing goal posts but can be moved as and when needed by a councillor or caretaker e.g. in the event of the recreation ground flooding
- Should a match be held with younger children e.g. at a Friday social the council or PMC can arrange for posts to be moved closer together to facilitate this
- Should the village want to clear the lower recreation ground e.g. in the event of a fete or other major event the posts can simply be moved out of the way

There is a small incremental cost for having moveable goal posts compared with fixed posts, but this is not judged significant when installation costs etc. are taken into account; moveable goal posts afford the most flexible option, and there are many in use on other local recreation grounds in the area.

The first stage of replacing the goal posts will be to remove the old ones and any associated fixings. Then the new ones will be installed and it'll only be possible to move them with the permission of a member of the council or PMC. There may be a short interval between removal and replacement during which no posts will be available.

The replacement of the goal posts is made possible by a generous donation from the 100 Club, combined with additional funds from the Parish Council. We would like to thank all villagers whose participation in the 100 Club have helped make this possible. We expect the new posts to be installed by early November.

Repairing and Improving Playground Equipment

Each year the Parish Council commission a lengthy report on the condition of the playground undertaken by a regulated inspector. The last inspection was in February 2024.

The inspector marks out any concerns, particularly with regards to health and safety, and suggests any remedial action that should be undertaken. The work that has been undertaken this year has targeted highlighted issues but also included other repairs as well.

Moulsford has been very fortunate in that all the repairs/improvements were completed by a volunteer from North Moreton, Mr Mark Goodman, without charge beyond materials. We are extremely grateful to him for his time and expertise.

Removal of somersault bars	These were damaged beyond repair and marked as unsafe by inspector
Repair of two picnic tables	One needed minor repair but one needed more extensive work
Lower steps and posts at bottom of ramp of Multiplay	All replaced
Safety mats under Multiplay	These have been replaced
Side panels on Multiplay	Missing rivets replaced
Rope bridge on Multiplay	Shackles replaced as recommended by inspector
Swing cradles. Both had been damaged (regrettably most likely by vandalism) beyond repair	Both replaced. It is hoped to be able to make up a spare by the cannibalization of the two damaged cradles

All of this work was completed for just under £750.00.

Longer Term Repairs/Improvements

In 2024, through the good fortune of finding such a capable volunteer, we have been able to deal with the most pressing issues by the specialized playground inspector. This should extend the life of the equipment. In addition through contact with specialized suppliers we are now much more aware of costs associated. In the next stage the Council will need to consider expenditure for replacing and repairing tiles underneath the swings and other areas.

Inspection

Finally, we are looking for volunteers to help us carry out regular inspections of the playground equipment. Our aim is to set up a rota system for three or four volunteers to take it in turns to run through a simple checklist onsite, a 10 minute process at most. Ideally these inspections would take place monthly during term time and weekly during school holidays, so we can keep a close eye on any emerging cause for concern. Spinning Club - Social Craft


Moulsford craft group meets on the 2nd Thursday of the Month and would like to invite anyone who already does crafting or would like to start crafting to join us.

Wallingford Local Producers Market

Wallingford Local Producers Market (WLPM) is held every Saturday morning from 10am to 12:30pm.

Markets are held in St Mary's Church in the centre of Wallingford. Usually, our food stalls can be found outside with our craft stalls inside.



WLPM hosts the best of locally-produced food and crafts that are grown, harvested and made within 30 miles of Wallingford. We champion local farmers and vegetable growers, cheese-makers, bakers, and makers of honey and preserves. Every market has a range of craft stalls including textiles, jewellery, ceramics, art and photography, all hand-made by local people.

Wallingford Emergency Food Bank

We are a registered charity operating a food bank based in the centre of Wallingford with the aim of providing emergency food packages to those who need them. Wallingford Emergency Food Bank was set up by Churches Together in the Wallingford Area and we began serving the community in 2011.

In the first year, we provided food for approximately 400 people. The current annual demand is approximately 3000 people. We rely entirely on unpaid volunteers and donations of food and money from the public, churches, and other local organisations.



We would love more churches, communities and people to get involved with the Streets of Light Trail in order to be part of bringing God's love, light and hope to their communities - turning streets that may be dark and scary, into streets of light, love and hope.

As this happens across the UK, rather than individual homes being a tiny, isolated pinprick of light on a map, we hope instead to see hundreds of these houses of light connected to each other, forming links and chains across neighbourhoods, cities and the country.

The ideas...

Please remember that your window can be really simple – for example using fairy lights or a light box is totally fine.

The key things to remember are:

Every window needs to include the words 'Light' or 'Love' or 'Hope' somewhere in the design.

Please don't have anything scary/frightening or linked to Halloween in your display. If you want to use pumpkins; then perhaps carve them with hearts, or the words light, love, or hope - instead of faces.

Your window needs to be lit from approximately 5:30-9:00pm each night. Just pop your light on and leave your curtains open - or maybe use a lamp on a timer if you won't be in.

Wheelyboat club on course to set new records!

Number of voyages made and passengers carried continue to soar!

Wallingford Accessible Boat Club (WABC), the local charity which enables disabled and less mobile people to get out and about on the River Thames, has today announced that its recently introduced 5-day per week service is proving to be a real winner, as evidenced by a sharp increase in the number of voyages made and passengers carried.

With more than one full month remaining of the wheelyboat season (at end of September), the number of both voyages delivered and passengers carried to-date are equivalent to the whole 2023 season. Over that year, 65 river trips were made carrying 252 passengers, at the time setting new records. This year these numbers will be smashed - despite the patchy summer weather!

WABC Chairman, John Jenkins MBE, elaborated: "We are all really excited about the popularity of our wheelyboat service. It is so very pleasing that so many disabled and elderly people in our area are taking advantage of the free-of-charge service we offer. Last winter, we implemented a wide-spread promotional campaign, targeting healthcare professionals across all segments of the community throughout Oxfordshire and today we are witnessing the results of that. The increased demand simply follows increased awareness."

Jenkins continued: "What's more, the increased capacity enabled by our 5-day per week service, announced in early June, enables us to cope with the demand – thanks to our brilliant team of trained volunteers. They are simply wonderful, being so willing and flexible with their crewing shifts, doing all they can to ensure our passenger voyages are always accommodated, if at all possible. I can't thank them enough!"

"I urge all disabled and less mobile people in South Oxfordshire to take full advantage of our service – come and have some fun on the river! There's still time this season but you'll need to hurry. Voyages are free of charge but in order to operate we are happy to accept donations. Simply book a voyage on our website www.wabc.org.uk"




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
