#### Apple Day: 20th October 2018

Moulsford's first Apple Day took place on a glorious sunny autumn afternoon, warm enough for us to throw open the veranda doors and entice a steady flow of folks to come along for a few hours of apple appreciation. While the younger (and some not so young) visitors tried their hands at apple printing, apple bobbing, making apple creatures and more, local cider was on tap for older visitors and I think everyone younger and older and downed a glass or more of freshly pressed apple juice, all made from

village apples. Many were also tempted by a nibble of a scone with apple jam and cream or a simple crunch of an apple. At the core of the event was our display table of different apples, mostly from around the village, all laid out as a traditional garden exhibition table. We had about 20 sets of apples, and though we didn't have a vast range of varieties, what was really striking was that even the same type of apple - Moulsford does a good line in Bramleys as it turns out - varied greatly across the village. I hope everyone who came went away a little more enthusiastic about the Great British Apple and hopefully we'll see you again next year!

Many people helped make the event such fun, so I'd like to extend a few thanks; the Events Committee for supporting the idea and the whole team's diverse help with refreshment logistics and kids' activities especially; Linda and Daryl Dixon need a special mention for their apple enthusiasm, helping to marshal the apple harvest and running the press; also for Janet Knowles' and Alison Fagg's contributions to the refreshment cause; and of course, many thanks to villagers who donated apples and shared their harvest with everyone. And finally, thanks to everyone who came along to try out something appley! It was truly a community event and I thank you all for making it a fruitful success.

Parish Council activities in the last few weeks have included progressing the pavilion driveway and village website refresh projects, running the CPR Refresher Training Session (see photo!), keeping track of SODC activity associated with STP works, querying OCC as to where our grit bin is, reviewing the annual play area safety inspection report, reviewing planning applications and dealing with ad hoc queries.

#### **CPR Refresher Training Session**

We've been fortunate in the village that the defibrillator on the pavilion has not had to be used "in anger" since installation in 2015. The session on 24<sup>th</sup> November we organised with South Central Ambulance Service (SCAS) to run through the basics of Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and how a Defibrillator is also used went well with a total of 19 villagers attending. The life-saving importance of having a basic knowledge of CPR is even more useful than knowing where the nearest defibrillator is so a a reminder poster on CPR is published in this issue of Moulsford News. For those of you with smartphones then there are several applications available for free download that identify the location of your nearest defibrillator while you're in the UK – the SCAS one that is relevant for our area is called "Save a Life" and currently only available for download to Apple devices.

#### **Potholes, Paths and Gullies**

With the autumn and winter weather over the next few months, if you notice potholes on pavements/roads and blocked gullies then do please head to the website <a href="http://www.fixmystreet.com">http://www.fixmystreet.com</a> where you can report the issue so that OCC Highways can schedule to get it resolved. If you have a smartphone then download the fixmystreet application and use it to take a photograph and provide a brief description to report the issue instead. Either way the reports will automatically route direct to OCC Highways and they do follow up quite quickly with either their own or third party contractor staff despatched.

#### **Parish Council Projects**

Driveway project activity is proceeding with quotes from potential sub-contractors expected back in late November such that we can decide on next steps and timing of site works. Similarly, the project to bring the village website up to date and aligned with the changing local government regulatory requirements is underway with two providers having been shortlisted from seven of eight suppliers who responded to a Request For Information. With the new website, it will be possible to access and download documents that could range from Parish Council minutes and agendas through to current and past editions of Moulsford News. The intention is that specific sections of the website will be able to be updated directly by, for example, Parish Clerk for Parish Council matters, Moulsford Events Committee for village social and fund raising events, Pavilion Management Committee, Moulsford News editor. Similarly, based on the play area safety inspection report, the Parish Council expects to undertake some refresh work on the play area to ensure that any low risks noted (this is the highest we have!) are minimised as much as is practical and that the play area equipment remains in good order. We expect to be seeking SODC Councillor grant contribution towards anything we progress with the play area.

#### **Underhill - Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) Works**

The latest update from SODC is that that planning permission was approved on 30<sup>th</sup> October 2018 but there is still work required to finalise legal and property agreements. Draft procurement documents are currently being finalised in readiness to go to tender once legal agreements have been completed and SODC are aiming to go to tender in March 2019 with a potential start date in late summer / early autumn 2019. Parish Council will continue to monitor and seek updates from SODC.

#### Neighbourhood Watch Coordinator - Volunteer Opportunity

Although we've had one or two expressions of possible interest, this volunteer opportunity still remains open. As highlighted in Moulsford News earlier this year, the duties are not onerous and mostly involve publicising messages

via email from the police, or more rarely from people in the village, who have seen something untoward. If this opportunity is something that you might be interested in to help the village then please register your interest with the Parish Clerk. If this role is not filled by the time of the December Parish Council meeting then the Parish Council will review options.

#### **Primary Schooling**

While relaxing over the festive break and thinking how fortunate we all are to live in such a lovely part of the country then do please reflect on whether there is something more that you personally could be doing to enhance and support life in Moulsford in 2019! This could be supporting more of the village social events, helping on the bar for the Friday socials, getting involved with the Moulsford Events Committee (MEC) a sub-committee of the Parish Council, the Pavilion Management Committee (PMC) or perhaps standing to be a Parish Councillor. You may already be involved in some way and if so we are grateful so thank you! Within six months though the term of the current Parish Council will have completed and in May 2019 we have local elections and a new Parish Council will be formed for the next four year term. If you are thinking of putting something back into the village by standing to be a parish councillor and you want to know what is involved then come along to a Parish Council meeting or have a chat to one of the existing Councillors – there is usually at least one of us at one of the village social events and we're friendly to chat with! The vibrancy of the village really is enhanced by these three village organisations running effectively together and the work and efforts they all do is almost entirely voluntary and being done not for any especial individual or team recognition but as a contribution to enhancing community life for everyone in the village in some way. To that end, big thank you on behalf of the village to MEC for their contribution of £1,500 to the Parish Council that was generated from the profits of social events this year. This funding, more than 10% of the current precept, will go towards Parish Council projects underway and planned.

From the Vicar Andrew Petit

My dear friends,

I have been fascinated to discover that there are now not one but two TV channels entirely dedicated to Christmas movies. One is called True Christmas and started on 24th September whilst the other, Christmas 24 claims it is *Christmas as it should be.* I guess most of us enjoy watching a Christmas movie from time to time, however schmaltzy it might be, because they always have a happy ending and they usually involve a story of redemption i.e. an individual who thinks they are a total failure or maybe a terrible curmudgeon (e.g. like Scrooge), whose life is transformed by the magic of Christmas. Usually Santa Claus is involved or sometimes a much vaguer general spirit of Christmas. I must admit I love some of these movies, but what amazes — and saddens me — is that virtually none of these movies have any recognition at all of the true meaning of Christmas or even why we have Christmas in the first place! Even when they sing a carol, it's usually Jingle bells or another song about reindeer. This is a tragedy because Christmas really is all about redemption, whether it is of individuals or families - but if we expect Santa Claus (or even Father Christmas), or the Christmas elf, or the sugar plum fairy, to be the one who makes that possible, we shall be sadly disappointed. Christmas is indeed all about the best story of redemption in the world, but Hollywood seems to have completely forgotten what it is!

The clue of course is in the name: Christmas (although sometimes Hollywood seems to have even forgotten that, with everyone greeting each other by saying: Happy Holiday). Christmas is of course all about the birth of Christ. Not only is it the most wonderful story, full of memorable characters and drama, but its meaning is even more wonderful. It is all about God seeing and understanding our desperate need for rescue and going to the extraordinary lengths of becoming a human being, one of us, by being born as a baby to very ordinary parents, because this was the only way the rescue mission could be carried out. We don't get to the end of the story until Easter, but Christmas is like the D-Day landings when, as the baby Jesus, God against all odds successfully establishes a beach-head on planet Earth.

It may be almost impossible for us to find this story on the Christmas TV channels, but I'm glad to say there are plenty of opportunities for you to enjoy this story and engage with it once again, here in Moulsford. We start off on Saturday 15th December with The Living Nativity up at Cholsey Meadows, On the next day, Sunday 16th at 4.30pm, there will be our beautiful Carols by Candlelight in Moulsford Parish Church. On Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> we have Village Carols again in the church and then of course our main celebration on Christmas Day suitable for all ages at 10am. So don't miss the chance to think again about the real meaning of Christmas!

### **Westminster Update**

#### **Ed Vaizey MP**



A number of new measures were announced in the budget last month. One I know will be very popular is £420m to fix potholes in England. A £28.8 billion National Roads Fund, paid for by road tax, is also being set up, the largest ever of its kind. Overall this Budget marked a turning point in public finances. Since 2009-2010 the deficit has fallen by four-fifths, from 9.9% to 1.9%. On average, spending on public services will grow 1.2% above inflation a year from next year until 2023-24. This is all brilliant news and I am very pleased that our efforts to combat the deficit over the last eight years are showing results.

Once again UTC Oxfordshire in Didcot is proving itself a trailblazer for secondary schools in the UK. Last month they officially opened a state-of-the-art cryogenics laboratory, in what's believed to be a first for a UK school. Ahead of the first set of projects in November, students will visit the world-facilities of the Science and Technology Facilities Council – based at Harwell Campus – to find out more about the benefits of and uses for cryogenics.

Congratulations to all those involved in organising the excellent Wantage Literary Festival last month. From talks

on history, politics and sport to comedy and gardening tips the festival was by all account a great success. I was very pleased to host Sir Oliver Letwin MP for a wide ranging evening covering British politics from Thatcher to May. Thank you to all who came and asked questions.

It was a great pleasure to open the new headquarters of Oxford Immunotec this month. Based in Milton Park and set up here as a start up in 2004, the company is now worth \$450m and is helping fight TB. I was also pleased to visit EMS Physio in Grove and see the progress on Grove Business Park.




