### **Parish Council Report**

MPC continues work on the Neighbourhood Planning Statement. Cllr Powell provides an update on our progress in this edition of MN, but the response to the survey was very good and much appreciated.

MPC are considering introducing a 100 Club for the enjoyment of the village which will assist with fundraising for village projects. This is a concept many of us are familiar with from involvement with PTA school fundraising as a basic form of private lottery – there will be winners! It is a fun and regular way to come together – could be at the Coffee Shop, or a Friday night social, or even online.

Nothing is in place yet so if you have any ideas, please get in touch particularly if you would like to help.

First, we need to gauge interest from the villagers of Moulsford so if you would like to take part in our 100 Club, please let any of the councillors know. Our contact details can be found on the back page of Moulsford News, or just tell us if you see us around.

Cllr Baker has been looking into provision of availability of places at Wallingford School, as promised in last month's MN here is her update: We are pleased to have received a reply from Hayley Good, Oxford County Council's Deputy Director of Children's Services & Education, in response to our concerns over access for Moulsford students to places at Wallingford School. Ms. Good confirmed the expansion of Wallingford School, from 190 places per year to 242 per year from next year, which was planned in line with forecasted demand from the school's catchment area; including from housing growth already permitted or in the Local Plan. It was highlighted that although there are inevitably some uncertainties, the school is currently finding places for out of catchment pupils and as in-catchment demand increases, in-catchment pupils will take priority. As a result, OCC does not consider there to be a risk of incatchment demand exceeding places over the next few years, but are more cautious in the longer term.

Ms. Good told us: "We will continue to monitor the situation over the coming years, but for now, Moulsford applicants who apply on time for a place at Wallingford School are expected to be successful. However, it must be stressed that the popularity of Wallingford School is likely to mean that late applicants, including those who move into the village after the secondary admissions process, may find the school full and be unable to secure a place. It is therefore vital that parents apply on time wherever possible."

#### **Neighbourhood Planning Statement**

We had 99 responses to the questionnaire and together with the input from the recent village meeting, this has given us a really good sense of what you as villagers view as important for our community going forwards.

We have revised dates somewhat and now have an update with South Oxfordshire District Planning Office and the other parishes participating in the pilot project on December 3rd. We then plan to create a first draft for early January and would like to present the results and recommendations to the village before completing the second draft and submitting to SODC by Easter. So watch Facebook/village notice boards for more details - we are aiming for mid / end January 2023.

We would like to thank everyone for their involvement in this so far and hope you will remain engaged. Don't forget, we can always use help on the work too, so if you feel you could contribute something on, for example, the environment, traffic & congestion, or planning please contact me, Sue Powell <a href="mailto:spowell@moulsford-pc.org.uk">spowell@moulsford-pc.org.uk</a>; the more contributors we have involved the better.

P.S. For those of you who asked why we did not include the church in the survey, this is because this survey was primarily focused around matters that are considered as part of the planning process.

#### What is a Parish Councillor - Jo Baker

I put my name forwards to stand for election as parish councillor in 2019, when there was a real risk that Moulsford would be left without its own Parish Council. Fortunately, enough people came forwards and a completely new Parish Council line-up was elected.

Being a rookie parish councillor at first felt quite daunting, but there was (and is) great support from the rest of the team and crucially, from the Parish Clerk to keep everyone in appropriate order. Plus, there have been useful opportunities for training workshops, for example on planning. After our election, it didn't seem long before we were tackling the challenge of the Friends of the Elderly planning application and taking a stand with the help of the wider community against the proposed development, all during the onset of the pandemic. For me, fighting this application absolutely defined why Moulsford needed its own Parish Council: without the MPC but represented instead as part of Cholsey, I think the FotE application would probably have succeeded. I was also really struck how many parishioners took the time to contribute their responses, adding their voices to protect our village and its special character.

During my time on the PC, it is not just been getting stuck into the planning process that I have found rewarding. Overall the PC may not have much direct power, but it has offered a platform to try and make a positive difference about issues I care about, such as the village environment with the Jubilee tree planting or engaging with OCC on access to education, or getting the Neighbourhood Planning Statement underway. At the recent planning enquiry, it felt like a privilege to speak up and say: "I represent Moulsford."

I very much hope that as the next round of Parish Council elections approaches in 2023, what we have done over the past few years will have encouraged a few more folks to step forwards and have a go at taking care of this distinctive, wonderful village we call home.

A big Thank You to everyone involved in organising the Tearfund Quiz on Saturday 19th November.

The evening was great fun with opportunities to meet friends, make new ones or catch up with village activities.

A cheque for over £300 will be forwarded to Tearfund enabling their work with communities devastated by flooding, draught or ravaged by war to be sustained. In addition, they also run programmes constructing hospitals, boring wells and building water storage facilities, alongside teaching new skills for cultivating draught resistant crops. All these activities can make the difference between a subsistence existence to increasing family incomes that in turn enable children to access educational opportunities.

There has been a request for the Quiz to be repeated next year and we have already received the date. I can confirm therefore, assuming no major crises, the event will be repeated on Saturday 18th November 2023!

We are able to announce now that our new Vicar will be **Rev. Rebecca Peters** who, along with her husband Daniel and daughters Ruth and Hannah, will be moving into the vicarage during February next year. So the waiting is almost over. **The licensing service that welcomes her into the Benefice and formally marks the beginning of her ministry with us will be held at St. Mary's Church Cholsey on Monday 20th February at 7:30 p.m.** 

This service is open for anyone to attend so we do hope it will be possible for as many members of our community that are able, to come along.

Like so many members of the village community, the church is beginning to gear up activities as we head into Advent - a period of preparation and quiet reflection leading up to Christmas.

As the commercial world seeks to tempt us into a flurry of present buying (often for things we don't need), kitchens begin emitting the wonderful aromas of mince pies, Christmas cakes and other culinary delights and the school plays with all the excitement as tensions build with all the end of term activities and party times, it's very easy to get so caught up in this whirl of activities that we arrive at Christmas exhausted, having forgotten what the true meaning of Christmas is all about.

## **Tree Time**

Welcome back to my article in the Moulsford News! This is now the third episode, and my chosen tree will be, drumroll please... a London Plane! You may have seen this tree before, with its distinct bark, which you will learn more about later on. So this time, I will explain this tree from the top to the bottom.

So at the top of every tree (almost every tree) is a crown, which I mentioned in the first episode. It is relatively large (of course depending on which type of plane it is) but it has quite loose foliage. The leaves making up this foliage are sycamore-like, thick and leathery, with five triangular lobes. They also turn a beautiful Orange-yellow color in autumn. (See picture 1 of the London plane's leaves)





The flowers of this tree are circular, usually bunched in pairs all over the tree, and are usually light green in colour. When these flowers bloom, they grow in size a lot but stay circular in shape. There are many smaller buds making up this fruit, but maybe you will understand me a little more if you take a look at picture 2.

Moving down still comes the trunk, my favourite part. The trunk of this tree is absolutely beautiful! It is in a camouflage like pattern, and it just looks epic! The shape of the trunk can be thick or thin, depending on its type, but the pattern stays the same. (See picture 3 for the trunk of this tree.)





This tree is valued for its ability to survive in extreme conditions, as well as pollution, and is therefore planted a lot in cities, and busy streets, and particularly in London, giving it the name London Plane. That is all for now, goodbye, see you all soon and have a good one!


