Parish Council Report

Following our recent November Parish Council meeting, the PC's thoughts turn this month towards the younger and older members of our community.

A substantial number of residents came to the PC meeting to raise their serious concerns about Friends of the Elderly's expansion plans for the Old Vicarage Care Home, revealed recently at a public drop in session at the Home. The proposal is for over 30 apartments, mainly two bedroom, to be built on the land adjacent to the village recreation ground. The Parish Council is also extremely concerned by the proposals and we encourage village residents to find out more about them at the community meeting on 6th December mentioned elsewhere in this issue. If a planning application is indeed submitted, we urge villagers to use their right to comment on the plans. Community input is a valuable part of the planning process, being a way to provide the local knowledge that planning officers may not have. The PC obviously gets to assess planning applications, but if you have an opinion, it's important for you to have your own say as well.

At the other end of the village age range, families with children now old enough to start school next year will be aware that applications for primary school places are now open. Access to places in local state schools was one of the key issues the incoming councillors were keen to explore, so it seems a good time to update residents with some news on this front. Hopefully readers will have already seen last month's survey about where village children

are going to school. Thanks very much to those who have taken the time to send us a response; we are still keen to hear from more families to give us the fullest picture possible of the logistics faced when getting Moulsoford children to school around the area.

The PC raised with County Councillor Mark Gray and District Councillor Anne-Marie Simpson the problems reported by Moulsoford residents about getting both primary and secondary places in local schools of choice, as we are disadvantaged by housing developments between Moulsoford and local schools meaning that we are potentially excluded from school places by the rules governing allocation by distance. Mark Gray was able to set up a meeting for us at Oxfordshire County Council with Chris Hilliard, Deputy Director for Education and Allyson Millward, Head of Access to Learning. Parish Councillors Jo Baker and Andy Bryan went with Mark to voice our concerns in person, to find out what the plans are for school developments around the Wallingford area in particular and what the implications are for Moulsoford children.

It was a very helpful meeting, giving us the opportunity to explain the issues being experienced with school applications and for the OCC officers to help us understand how school planning and application processes function. It was accepted that Moulsoford does have some issues getting local places, particularly at secondary level, and OCC will track Moulsoford's application success over the next few years. If there is a pattern developing which shows we are being consistently disadvantaged, OCC will work with us to try to find a solution where possible in conjunction with local schools. However, we were also told about expansion plans in local schools over the next few years, including developments of primary schools in Wallingford in addition to the expanded numbers already available at Cholsey Primary. For secondary, Wallingford School is set to expand significantly from 2022, which the planners anticipate should meet the needs of the planned housing developments in and around the town. It is also hoped that other school expansions around the area will help divert some of the pressure currently on Wallingford. There is no immediate plan to develop a new secondary school at Wallingford, but clearly the education planning teams are monitoring the situation.

The officers were also keen to remind us how important it is to use the application process carefully for both primary and secondary places. In particular, they emphasised the need to put the most wanted school as first preference, as schools use preferences to prioritise applications; apparently the importance of this is sometimes misunderstood. They also wanted to remind families to use all the preferences, as only putting down one or two cuts out the chance of getting into a preferred school if the top preferences cannot be met. 34 New Homes Proposed on the Boundary of the Recreation Ground

Moulsoford is a small village in an area of outstanding natural beauty. We are privileged to live here. The village provides a home to two expanding schools. Inevitably traffic has increased and is set to increase further, but the village has, to a great extent, retained its character and spirit of community.

As a village resident, you should be aware of this proposed development as it has the potential to fundamentally alter the village you live in.

The Old Vicarage is preparing to submit a planning application for thirty four additional one and two bedroom apartments. These will form a continuum of very visible two-storey buildings on the boundary of the recreation ground behind the Pavilion.



The proposed apartments are for people aged 55+ who have a minimum care requirement of 1½ hours per week. This type of accommodation is part of a programme termed Extra Care. In essence, providing accommodation so people can be cared for “at home” not “in a home”. However, the definition of care is broad and could be as simple as help with domestic chores or shopping. The proposal is for self contained apartments for people, some of whom are still active, perhaps at work and may even have a child still at home.

It is a development of thirty four new homes. In our village that represents an increase of almost 13%. All in one go, all in one place.

The impact on our village extends well beyond immediate neighbours of the Old Vicarage.

The development will fundamentally and permanently change the appearance of the central village area around the recreation ground. It will bring more traffic to the roads that are often heavily congested and those existing homes bordering the recreation ground will be faced by tall, well lit buildings.

This is not to imply that Extra Care is not a worthwhile concept, but on top of all the development that has occurred in the village, is this expansion right for Moulsoford, or should it be opposed? Regardless of other issues is it sensible to build such a development in a village which has few amenities and very limited public transport?

Your views are critical. There will be a village meeting on Friday 6th December, 7:00pm in the Pavilion so please come along and learn more about the proposed plans and hear the concerns of those who attended the consultation meeting with the Old Vicarage and share your views.

From the Vicar

My dear friends,

The last time we had a general election in December was on 6th December 1923, when Stanley Baldwin was elected prime minister. I am not sure if there is anyone in Moulsoford who can remember that occasion first-hand ! They may however be a few who remember their parents or grand-parents telling them about it.

When the current general election was announced, there was some debate about whether it was fair or appropriate to have a general election so close to Christmas. For Christians, the election being on the 12th December, comes right in the middle of the season of Advent. The word “Advent” means “coming” or “arrival” and so it is not just about preparing to celebrate at Christmas the first coming of Christ 2000 years ago, but also preparing for the promised coming of Christ in glory.

Whether you believe in that promise of Christ or not (it was certainly a claim he made on many occasions), the idea of Christ returning in glory may well help focus our minds as we face the very difficult and challenging question of who to vote for in this Advent election.

Christ avoided getting bogged down in political debate, but he did talk about ushering in a kingdom of justice, love and peace. He sometimes compared his coming in glory to being like the owner of a large estate returning from a trip away, much later than expected, but at a time which catches the entire household by surprise. The question his parable poses is: would we be ready for this unexpected return? Would we be found carrying out our duties of carefully looking after his estate, or would we be found to be neglecting that stewardship entrusted to us by the master?

When we apply this to the general election, it may mean asking which candidate or which party is most likely apply those values of Christ's kingdom: values of compassion, justice, peace and careful stewardship of our planet?

I have no doubt that different people will come up with different answers, but I still think it is a very good question for each of us to ask? If we are at all concerned to keep Christ at the centre of Christ-mas, then that will affect every area of our lives – even general elections!


