## **Parish Council Report**

#### **Sarah Elvy**

May is the month marking the start of a new year for parish councils including the election of chair and vice-chair, declarations and acceptance of office, signing codes of conduct and confirming registers of interest. For the current Moulsford Parish Council, 2022/23 will be our last year and we are keen to press on with our projects so we may handover to the new council in May 2023 in good order.

#### **Recreation Ground**

The team has made a very good start with the recreation field enhancement and received many positive comments, but this is a long-term project and will continue under the new council.

#### On The Web

Work on a new parish website is underway. In future this will become the main source of information for parishioners, complemented by our traditional channels of Moulsford News, our noticeboards and Facebook.

#### **Public Meeting**

The sewage plant upgrade in Underhill, completed last year, has required some reallocation of allotments and it has inspired us to think how else we might use the unadopted areas of the site.

This, along with progress on other projects will be presented at our public Annual Parish Meeting in the pavilion on Thursday 26th May, 2022. All residents of voting age are welcome to attend, ask questions and get involved. As well as the usual village organisations, we are inviting other Moulsford groups to come along and explain how they enhance life in our village. This is a great opportunity to learn more about what goes on in your community and perhaps even find the inspiration to get involved too. And as has become established tradition, the Parish Council provides free refreshment - alcoholic and otherwise - when business is over.

#### **Traffic And Parking**

Finally, a reminder that we now have a dedicated email address for the reporting of traffic and parking issues in Moulsford, <a href="mailto:trafficandparking@moulsford-pc.org.uk">trafficandparking@moulsford-pc.org.uk</a>. This lets us track and record any infringements and use the data to help frame our own plans. Crucially it will also help guide objections to any plans that potentially impact traffic and parking. This email address will now appear routinely in Moulsford News and on the village Web site at moulsford-pc.org.uk.

#### **Oxfordshire Climate Change Survey**

The county council is running a survey to discover people's understanding of and opinions about climate change across Oxfordshire.

This is part of a countywide project we're involved in to increase awareness of the impact of climate change and inspire behaviour change.

The survey results will be used to help develop a new online tool to help people across Oxfordshire find climate actions they can take which are relevant to them.

#### Street naming consultation

The government is asking people to comment on proposals to alter the process for changing street names. This includes replacing the current system with a single requirement for a residents' vote on any changes to street names and some changes to regulations and statutory guidance for councils. Two car loads filled to bursting point with clothing, games, toys and bedding were dispatched within a few days of receiving the information. In addition we were able to forward details of people willing to act as translators and offering professional counselling skills. As the current news from Ukraine of escalating hostilities begins again, I am sure the situation will continue to fluctuate. We will circulate news updates as and when we receive details if any further requirements are needed, but at present they were delighted to receive our contributions that have enabled them to cover all their present needs.

We have just celebrated a joyful Eastertide with special services giving thanks for Christ's sacrifice and resurrection, gifts given for us all. In addition to the beautiful spring flowers and the traditional Easter garden (not forgetting the chocolate eggs!), the church was also delighted to be able to hang two beautifully constructed banners depicting

these contrasting events. If you are passing do pop into church and take a look. We give thanks for the skill and time that a small group put into designing and creating the banners for us all to see and reflect upon. All these acts of kindness and generosity are made possible by different groups of people within our community who come together regularly to clean, arrange flowers and take such good care of the churchyard. 

#### **Gardening diary**

Hello! This month I (obviously) did lots of gardening. We sowed some beetroot, spring onions and carrots in a raised bed that my dad made. How? There was already some soil ready and then we just dug out 5 rows with our hands and sprinkled the seeds in. Can you guess what I did next? Of course! I watered them! We had 2 rows of beetroot, two rows of spring onions and one row of carrots. So... Do you remember how in my new bed in the allotment I planted some onions and broad beans? Well the onions worked really well, I'm really pleased with how they're getting on, but the broad beans just totally failed. So I

weeded the area, planted some new ones in the same spot and, while I was doing it, I found a broad bean from last time which had rotted. Then I thought that it might be nice to have some colourful flowers in the bed as well so I dug 2 holes in the corners of the other sides of the beds, moved some sunflowers out of their pots and into the bed and watered the entire bed. My bare root strawberries also failed (now I know never to get bare root plants again), they remained shriveled and black and never did anything at all. So I bought some new strawberries from the garden center and moved them into the tyre bed. Then I watered them too. Earlier I repotted some tomatoes and peppers into much bigger pots. First there were lots of small pots cluttering up the windowsill and now there are lots of big pots cluttering up the greenhouse. Soon we will be going to collect some horse manure from a nice lady who owns horses nearby. We will shovel the manure into old compost bags and bring it back home. Bye for now, here's the quiz.


