Moulsford Parish Council is looking for a new parish clerk, who can spare around 9 hours per week to keep our parish council running smoothly. The Clerk provides administrative and clerical support to the Council, as well as managing the Council's finances.

You'll have experience in administration or clerical work and be able to maintain accurate financial records, demonstrate a calm, organised approach to work, show attention to detail, and possess good communication and customer service skills. You should also be accustomed to using a computer, including Word processing and Excel spreadsheets.

Responsibilities include:

- Helping set up parish council meetings, attending and taking minutes.
- Managing administration related to the parish council, including record keeping, managing the review of planning applications, and handling queries from outside organisations.
- Managing the day-to-day accounts for the parish council, as well as assisting with the smooth running of the annual external audit.
- Updating the village website, Facebook page, etc. (e.g. notice of council meetings).
- Managing relationships with external contractors, e.g. grass cutting, general maintenance.

The majority of work can be done from home, at hours to suit you. No prior experience of working for parish councils is necessary, though if successful in securing the role, we would encourage you to attend suitable training, for which we would cover the cost. A laptop will be supplied for your use.

Can you help bring some happiness to a child living in a Refuge?

As many of you will be aware for several years there has been a link between our village church and a township parish in South Africa. This partnership between St John the Baptist church in Moulsoford with St Phillips the Apostle in Huhudi South Africa has developed over the past 17 years and enabled both communities to grow in our mutual learning, helped to support food, clothing and the education particularly for children and some very disadvantaged families living in the informal settlement (Shacks) and much more as we continue to share the ups and downs of community life.

This year during our visit we were taken to a Women and Children's refuge close to Huhudi. It was a humbling experience to observe families, torn apart through violence and abuse, attempting to come to terms with the dramatic changes in their lives. The refuge was being run well with good support from a dedicated team of people. Families felt safe as they adjusted to their new environment. We however quickly became aware of one glaring absence at the refuge, there were **no toys** for the children to play with within the security of the refuge.



Wallingford Local Producers Market

Wallingford Local Producers Market (WLPM) is held every Saturday morning from 10am to 12:30pm.

Markets are held in St Mary's Church in the centre of Wallingford. Usually, our food stalls can be found outside with our craft stalls inside.

WLPM hosts the best of locally-produced food and crafts that are grown, harvested and made within 30 miles of Wallingford. We champion local farmers and vegetable growers, cheese-makers, bakers, and makers of honey and preserves. Every market has a range of craft stalls including textiles, jewellery, ceramics, art and photography, all hand-made by local people.



Wallingford Emergency Food Bank

We are a registered charity operating a food bank based in the centre of Wallingford with the aim of providing emergency food packages to those who need them. Wallingford Emergency Food Bank was set up by Churches Together in the Wallingford Area and we began serving the community in 2011.

Wheelyboat club announces amazing results for 2024!

Number of voyages made and passengers carried smash previous records!

Wallingford Accessible Boat Club (WABC), the local charity which enables disabled and less mobile people to get out and about on the River Thames, has today announced that the 2024 season has not only broken, but smashed, all previous records for the number of voyages made and passengers carried. The results are absolutely amazing!

The Club, a totally voluntary organisation now in its fourth year of operation, delivers what is clearly a very popular service based on its wheelyboat, the much-loved WOW-one. Despite the very mixed weather and river conditions throughout the boating season, causing 11 voyage cancellations, WABC recorded:

89 Voyages conducted – 37% up on last season

405 Passengers carried – 61% up on last season

With passenger ages ranging from 1 to 100 years old, including 55 wheelchair and 11 powerchair users, with people with one of at least 24 different disabilities ranging from MND, Learning Difficulties, Epilepsy, Dementia, Diabetes, ADHD, and Autism to Polio, Cerebral Palsy, Rhett's Syndrome, Fibromyalgia, MS, and Rheumatoid Arthritis.

Clearly a service for All!

WABC Chairman, John Jenkins MBE, elaborated: "We are all really excited about our season's results – they are truly amazing! It is clear, and very pleasing, that we are offering a service that disabled and less mobile people really want to take full advantage of. The pleasure and enjoyment they derive from a trip on our lovely river says it all and without WABC they would forfeit all that. And it's all down to our volunteers who make it happen – it is remarkable how much a determined, flexible, caring group can achieve, and enjoy doing so, helping so many. They are wonderful"

Jenkins continued: "Next year, with our planned move to Riverside Moorings in central Wallingford where we will be highly visible to a wider public and able to offer greater flexibility of the river trips we can undertake, we are hoping to do more – to get even more disabled people out on the river. We will be recruiting more volunteers over the winter period so if is anyone out there who shares our values and wants to get involved in our fun group, do please get in touch at john.jenkins@wabc.org.uk. Full training will be given and, upon completion, a smart WABC uniform!"
