Parish Council Matters

Parish Council Report

The new session of the Parish Council has started with a flurry of activity! We were delighted to welcome 4 members of the public at our June parish meeting, raising concerns regarding river access, the state of the roads (particularly on the A329 as you come into the village from the south side), and overgrown footpaths. Dates for upcoming meetings are shown elsewhere in this newsletter and I would encourage you to come along, find out what we do, and raise any concerns you may have directly with us.

At that same June meeting, we were delighted to vote in Melanie Mousley Jones as our 5th Moulsford councillor; we are now up to full strength. Melanie brings experience in project management, charity, and counselling roles, as well as a keen interest in the environment.

At time of writing, meetings are being scheduled with both private schools in the village to discuss future plans and how we continue to work together. An on-site meeting is also set on 30th June with Oxfordshire County Council Highways to discuss traffic, congestion, and parking issues in Moulsford and how these might be resolved. Whilst on the administration side, we are going through the annual audit process for the first time as a new council; a learning process!

Elli the Gardener



Hello, welcome back. As you may have noticed, there was no Elli the gardener article last month. A few people have told me how they missed my article last month, which made me really happy that you guys like it. But I have decided to only write an article once every two months from now on, as I am quite busy at the moment with schoolwork and other things. I hope that that is ok with all of you. Now back to the article!

Gardening diary

These last two months I have done a fair bit of gardening. First, I planted some runner beans around a wigwam of poles. Now, a month later, they are already fairly high, and have twisted themselves around the poles nicely, without any guidance from us. We didn't even need to tie them on once! I am very happy with their progress. I have harvested my shallots, and they are drying next to the garlic (which I planted in October or November last year in our big bed) in the greenhouse. Of course that means that we have more space where the shallots used to be, so we went to the garden center, had a nice (vegetarian) full english breakfast and got some dwarf french beans. Me and Emily also picked five alpines which my dad then put in an old sink afterwards. They look very pretty! The dwarf french beans have been planted into pots so that they can be put into the bed once they are big enough, so that the slugs and snails don't eat them up before they've had a chance. We have also all planted a pumpkin, for halloween. Mine is called THE OMEGA PUMPKIN. I am hoping that it grows bigger than all the others. I think that's it for this month. Bye!

Wallingford Accessible Boat Club Celebrates as Planning Permission Granted

Wallingford Accessible Boat Club (WABC), the local charity aiming to enable disabled people and the less mobile to get out on the river, are at last, celebrating! The Club has taken a major step towards the achievement of its goal to bring the operation of its wheelyboat, WOW-one, to central Wallingford.

The Planning permission, which covers both SODC and Environment Agency planning, has finally been granted for the development of disabled-friendly facilities for the Club's wheelyboat at Riverside, Wallingford on the site adjacent to Wallingford leisure park. For the past three years WABC have been working with SODC, leaders of the development, to create such a facility and waiting for the past year or so for planning permission. Now, to the delight of this increasingly popular voluntary organisation, they have it!

WABC Chair John Jenkins MBE commented: "I am absolutely delighted by this news as is every member of our Club – what a breakthrough!. At last we can see the light at the end of the tunnel – clearly we still have a long way to go until we have the facilities we need but the way forward is a lot more straightforward. Perhaps now we can realistically hope for Riverside becoming our operating base, our home, for the 2024 season. Wouldn't that be wonderful!"

Jenkins continued: "Whilst the Riverside facilities have been designed primarily for WABC purposes, it will also provide disabled-friendly access to the general public and thus become a major addition to Wallingford's 'leisure and pleasure' facilities for disabled people within our community, something it badly needs."

"Finally, I want to add my thanks to members of the SODC project team who have demonstrated not only real commitment to the development but also great creativity with its design which has been instrumental in overcoming the Environment Agency's initial planning objections."

Over 400 Walkers take part in North Wessex Downs Walking Festival 2-11 June 2023

Over 400 walkers took part in the third North Wessex Downs Walking Festival which finished last Sunday. Twentysix walks have taken place over nine days. There were events across the area including walks starting from Devizes, Whitchurch, Uffington, Pangbourne and Marlborough - to name just a few.

The North Wessex Downs has top class walking country on offer and the walking festival is the perfect opportunity for residents and visitors to explore more of this fascinating and beautiful landscape.

This year walkers have heard intriguing stories from the past, discovered wildflowers and butterflies, strolled across farms, explored the Ridgeway, learnt about ancient trees and even practiced their art journaling skills with the support of a professional artist. Walk leaders have included local historians, farmers and land managers, a Savernake Forest ranger as well as knowledgeable community walk leaders.

Anne Shepley, Communications Officer from North Wessex Downs AONB said: "This year's walking festival has been our best yet with a huge diversity of walks across the AONB. We have been particularly pleased to be able to offer walks on a number of farms where we have been working with farmers on activities which are having a direct and positive impact for wildlife and nature.

Walkers have come from as far afield as Brighton and West London to take part.

We are extremely grateful to all our walk leaders, most of whom are volunteers, for helping us deliver the walking festival."

Withymead Nature Reserve and Little Meadow

We are also launching our first 'Free for All' August Saturdays, offering another chance to just turn up and enjoy the reserve 12-5pm on 5, 12, 19 August during the school holidays. With shady spots, paths to discover and quiet moments with a pair of binoculars in the bird hides, it's another wonderful chance to spend time at the reserve when you are looking for something to do on those long hot summer days. There's no need to book for any of these afternoons, just come along.

You can also make a private booking on Fridays and Saturdays through to the end of August (excluding August Saturday afternoons from 12noon). Routine time slots are 10:00-12:00hrs, 12:00-14:00hrs, and 14:00-16:00hrs. You can check availability and book on our website, allowing at least 24 hours in advance of your visit. Make the most of your visit and bring a picnic to enjoy sitting at our waterfront deck, or a flask of tea, coffee or soup to sip whilst perched in one of our hides. These are open to all individuals, families, friends, clubs, not for profit organisations and educational groups or anyone who wishes to savour this local wildlife site. If you'd like to book a commercial hire, you are welcome to book under site hire.

The charity (ACCT) and its volunteers also manage Little Meadow, a floodplain wildflower meadow south of Goring, just before the railway bridge. Thames Path users will soon see some path improvements taking place, all being well, in July. Local contractors will re-engineer the path to provide a hard wearing surface so you can run and walk more safely in future years. It will also be restored to its original route closer to the river. Work will take approximately three weeks. For pedestrian safety, the work area will be fenced off and a temporary path created through the meadow. We advise keeping dogs on leads. Thank you in advance for your patience and respect for the measures and signage in place to manage the work safely, particularly when heavy plant machinery is being moved or is in use.

We also look forward to visitors once again being able to read our noticeboard and enjoy sitting on the benches at either end of the meadow!

The work is funded by a substantial grant from the Trust for Oxfordshire's Environment (TOE) with funding from Grundon Waste Management Ltd through the Landfill Communities Fund. Partial match funding has also been provided by the Thames Path National Trail. We'd like to thank them for their generous support.

The Anne Carpmael Trust, which owns the Withymead Nature Reserve, is seeking someone with a financial background to join the Trustee Board and take over the role of Treasurer. The trust has an annual income of around £30,000. The duties of the Treasurer include maintaining the financial records and preparing the annual accounts.
