## Parish Council Report

Over the festive period, Moulsford Parish Council (MPC) have been working on the village budget for 2020, researching the playground restoration and improvement, exploring the value of a local plan, reviewing planning applications.

### Village Finances

MPC have asked SODC for a small rise in the precept of £250 (1.7%). This will help cover increased costs for general village maintenance, annual premiums and subscriptions. We had hoped to be able to absorb these rises but due to the significant election costs for 2019 just received, we are seeking a modest increase which equates to approximately £1 per household for the year.

### Playground

After assessments of our damaged equipment by a couple of playground suppliers, we are looking into available support from SODC to pursue a claim on the original vendor for supplying equipment being unfit for purpose. Of course the outcome is by no means guaranteed so we will continue with our fundraising which has got off to a good start with generous support from our local schools and businesses.

In addition, we are keen to use this frustrating situation to bring about something positive for Moulsford so we are consulting with a landscape architect to understand how best to use our recreation space bearing in mind the feedback to our survey as well as current usage. We are seeking additional SODC support to help us with this project.

## Neighbourhood Development Plan

Commonly known as Neighbourhood Plans, these are produced to help local communities influence the development in their areas. For a small community such as Moulsoford the cost, both monetary and in terms of resources, can be prohibitive. We are currently considering the value of a neighbourhood plan looking at communities similar to Moulsoford who have developed a plan or rejected doing so.

## Underhill Sewage Plant Works

The Sewage Plant works are expected to start in spring 2020, although we are still waiting for final confirmation and a commencement date. The access to the site in Underhill is very tight for large, heavy vehicles, which means they often have to ride over the kerbs which are damaged as a consequence. As OCC Highways are unable to decrease the width of the kerb to make more room for road users this damage is likely to be exacerbated. We will be monitoring the situation by keeping a photographic record which, if necessary, can be used to support our claim to repair the damage after the works have finished.

Finally, MPC has made a couple of changes to the schedule of our council meetings. Firstly, we have moved the time of the meetings to commence at 7.30pm (instead of 8pm). Secondly, for February and March we have moved our meeting dates from the second Weds of the month. Our next meetings will be held on Weds 5<sup>th</sup> February and Weds 18<sup>th</sup> March, we hope to see you then!

## From the Vicar

My dear friends,

The end of January and beginning of February often have the coldest and most miserable weather of the year. The fun and excitement of Christmas is over; Spring has not yet properly started and the days are still depressingly short. It is often a time when many are prone to *Seasonal affected disorder (SAD)*. If we are feeling blue, whether it is mild sadness or a much more serious depression, whatever the cause might be, the Bible offers some very helpful advice, which is to develop the habit of *thanksgiving*.

When we are down it is very easy to focus on our problems or all the ways in which we wish our life were different, which generally drives us into a deeper and deeper depression. To counter-act this, it is always good to focus on the good things that we do have and our blessings, however small they might seem to be. It is helpful not only to reflect on what these are but specifically to give thanks for them. There might be an individual in our life that we can thank for particular blessings, or if not, we can always thank God, who is the source of all good things – sometimes directly and sometimes through the other people that He has placed in our lives. St Paul wrote: *Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.* Remarkably Paul was writing these words not from some ivory tower, but chained up in prison having been falsely accused on trumped up charges. And he practised what he preached. Often he was writing to communities of believers who had come to faith through his ministry but who were giving him all sorts of head-aches and concerns; yet invariably he would begin by saying words to the effect of *whenever I think about you, I thank God for you because...*

So if you are feeling down, why not spend a couple of minutes each day – maybe before you go to sleep or on your way to work - thinking about the things you can be thankful for and actually saying, in your heart or even out loud, "Thank you". You may find it a bit difficult or unfamiliar at first, but the more you do it, the better you will become at finding things for which you can be grateful. In fact, even if you are not feeling down, it's a great habit to cultivate.

If you do try this and you find it helps, do let me know. I'd love to hear from you.

## Update on the proposed development at the Old Vicarage

Following the Friends of the Elderly Nursing and Care Home consultation meeting in October, which outlined plans for thirty-four new homes on the boundary of the recreation ground behind the Pavilion.

Moulsoford residents who attended the consultation were extremely concerned about the size and the resulting impact of this development on the central village recreation area. These individuals formed a group, (Moulsoford Residents Group), to co-ordinate communication to the Friends of the Elderly and their advisors. The Group decided that given that this proposed development increases the number of homes in Moulsoford by 13%, the wider community should be aware of the Group's activities and the status of communication between Moulsoford Residents Group and the developers.

To this end, here is a short summary of activities and actions to date, along with any relevant update.

11<sup>th</sup> November - Moulsoford Residents Group sent twenty-four questions to the Friends of the Elderly's advisors. These questions addressed environmental, wildlife and planning matters.

6<sup>th</sup> December - A very well attended village meeting reviewed the proposed development. There was universal concern.

11<sup>th</sup> December - Response received to questions submitted on 11<sup>th</sup> November. Copies of the response can be sent to you, please request from [moulsofordresidents@gmail.com](mailto:moulsofordresidents@gmail.com). Although we've requested copies of Bat and Tree survey reports, these are being withheld on the premise that they are confidential.

18<sup>th</sup> December - Moulsoford Residents Group sent supplementary questions requesting transparent sharing of information. Copies of our questions can be requested from [moulsofordresidents@gmail.com](mailto:moulsofordresidents@gmail.com). To date no responses have been received.

To be clear, at the time of writing, no planning application has yet been made, therefore there are limited details. Over the coming weeks Moulsoford Residents Group will be pursuing responses to our questions and gathering as much information as possible on the nature and impact of the proposed development. We will ensure through Moulsoford News, Facebook and flyers that as a resident of the village you are aware of what is being proposed and have the information to act upon, should you choose to do so.

What's available:

- Self-care is the best choice for minor illnesses and injuries – a range of common winter ailments can be treated at home with a well-stocked medicine cabinet. Having a winter plan – such as keeping stocked up on medicines, keeping your home warm, and looking out for neighbours – can also be beneficial.
- Local pharmacies can give advice on several conditions, such as coughs, headaches, upset stomachs and skin conditions, as well as advise on stopping coughs and colds from getting worse.
- NHS 111 has call handlers who can help you choose the right health services for your needs, as well as a website. NHS 111 can put you in touch with a clinician, a GP, book you an appointment at your nearest minor injuries unit. You can also use NHS 111 online [111.nhs.uk](http://111.nhs.uk)
- Minor injuries units can treat deep cuts, small burns, sprains, sports injuries, and infected wounds. To find out your nearest MIU please visit the Oxford Health website
- Your local GP may offer extended opening hours into the evening or at the weekend.

**Most importantly, only attend Emergency Departments when there is a genuine emergency, such as loss of consciousness, suspected heart attack or stroke, severe breathing difficulties, or severe bleeding that cannot be stopped.**
